

### Anti-Bullying Week

Last week saw us recognise Anti-Bullying week This included a whole school assembly on Tuesday where we clarified the definition of bullying and reminded everyone how we can be respectful to each other at all times. As a reminder to everyone, we define bullying as 'Intentional', 'An Imbalance of Power' and 'Ongoing'. We welcome your support in using this language at home, should you need to discuss an issue with your child. ### Mobile Phones

There is no doubt that, over the last few years, the age at which children are given a smartphone has dropped significantly. As a school, we understand the importance of getting in touch with your child, especially as they become more independent and are walking to and from school on their own. However, it is increasingly brought to our attention that children are using these devices inappropriately, accessing deeply inappropriate images and sometimes sending concerning messages on various online groups.

As we head rapidly towards Christmas, please consider whether your child really needs a smartphone and, certainly, if your child already has a device of this sort, please monitor their use carefully, to ensure they are accessing age appropriate applications and content.

## Laurel Avenue

It has been brought to my attention that there has been some recent 'near misses' when children have been crossing the road at Laurel Avenue. Last week, we reminded the children to Stop, Look, Listen when they are crossing roads and to ensure they cross at appropriate points, having full sight of the whole road. Please drive and park courteously in all the roads around our school, mindful that children are crossing at particularly times of the day.
