# Home Learning Tasks

### Art

Either after a daily walk, out in your garden or looking out of your window, create a picture to show what you can see, hear and how you feel. Think about colours and resources you could use. Think about little details that maybe you have just started to notice. Give your artwork an appropriate title and don't forget to sign your master piece!

## Design and Technology

Design or make a model of a machine that you think would help us to look after our planet. You could produce a detailed drawing or have a go at building a 3D model. Include an explanation text as to what your machine would do and some instructions for how it would work.



#### Science

Design and produce a poster that looks at different habitats that you might find on the Isle of Man. What kind of animals and plants do you find there? What makes them different to other habitats? Are they used for different things?

Can you think of any habitats that are not on the Isle of Man? Why do you think this is?

Reading a range of books, magazines and information texts with your child regularly will help many areas of the curriculum, such as independent learning and developing research skills.
