Temptations/failing to do something (recap what Lin had to come across)

Range of sentence types - Short sentence for effect. Embedded clauses for detail.

Rhetorical question?

Fronted adverbials

Subordinating conjunctions to add detail to sentences

Characters and setting in detail through actions, motives, appearance and feelings throughout the story not in one paragraph.

Build up of information making sure ideas/events link.

Build up of atmosphere/suspense by withholding information.
